Celebrating Johor's Heritage: The Launch of Pentas Seni Johor @ B5 Johor Street Market

On 14 October 2024, B5 Johor Street Market became the vibrant heart of Johor's cultural landscape with the official launch of the Pentas Seni Johor Initiative by Yang Berhormat Tuan Raven Kumar Krishnasamy, the Executive Council of Unity, Arts and Culture of Johor. In line with the Visit Johor 2026 agenda, the initiative aimed to promote the arts, culture and heritage of the "Jewel of the South". Organised by Yayasan JCorp with Johor Heritage Foundation, this event paid tribute to Johor's rich heritage and kicked-off a cultural movement uniting local artists, performers and artisans that highlighted the state as a key destination for arts and heritage in Malaysia.

Programme Achievements

- **40 local artists and 20 artisans participated** in the event, presenting traditional dances such as Zapin and Inang, along with Chinese and Indian performances.
- **RM40,000** in income generated for local artists, artisans and existing B5 entrepreneurs, providing a significant boost to the local economy.
- **Approximately 400 visitors**, including cultural enthusiasts and tourists, attended the event and enjoyed a wide variety of cultural activities and exhibitions.
- **100 youth participated** in workshops such as textured art and macramé, where they gained hands-on experience with Johor's artistic traditions.

Yayasan JCorp's Support for B40 Students

Yayasan JCorp remains steadfast in its mission to alleviate the financial burdens of B40 families and students pursuing higher education. By providing targeted financial assistance, the foundation continues to empower deserving individuals across Malaysia, ensuring equitable access to education and fostering future leaders.



The Higher Education Financial Assistance Programme specifically targets full-time students from households with:

- A total income of less than **RM4,000**.
- An average income per family member below **RM800**.

Eligible students receive one-off financial aid based on their level of study:

- Certificate and Diploma students: **RM700**.
- Bachelor's Degree and Master's students: **RM1,000**.

Our Missions

- Alleviate financial burdens by supporting B40 families through financial aid for students, allowing them to focus on their studies.
- Promote equitable access to education by ensuring students from underprivileged backgrounds have equal chances to pursue higher education.
- Foster future leaders by investing in the education of B40 students to support the development of future leaders in Malaysia.

Programme Achievements



In 2024, Yayasan JCorp provided financial assistance to over **190 students from B40 families, investing a total of RM180,000**.

Since 2017 the foundation has reached more than **1,424** recipients, with a cumulative investment of **RM786,689** dedicated to easing the educational journey of students from underprivileged backgrounds.

United for a Greener Future: Plogging Success at Ibrahim International Business District

A commendable effort to preserve the environment was witnessed at the Ibrahim International Business District (IIBD) in Johor Bahru on 8 December 2024. A total of 120 volunteers, including representatives from Majlis Bandaraya Johor Bahru (MBJB), JLand Group Sdn Bhd, Universiti Teknologi Malaysia (UTM), SWM Environment Sdn Bhd and Yayasan JCorp, participated in a plogging activity that resulted in the collection of 45kg of waste.

The plogging activity formed part of the broader Urban Lab IIBD Programme, a JLand Group Sdn Bhd initiative, that aimed to gather feedback and insights from the public, community and all stakeholders involved. The programme which ran from 22 November to 15 December 2024 included an exhibition at the Atrium KOMTAR JBCC in Johor Bahru, focusing on urban rejuvenation within the IIBD area. On top of achieving immediate environmental benefits, this initiative also laid the groundwork for future efforts to maintain and improve Johor Bahru's urban landscape.

A Beacon of Hope for Johor's Island Communities

Yayasan JCorp, launched the Monsoon Relief: Waves of Support initiative in collaboration with Yayasan Sultan Ibrahim Johor, showcasing their solidarity and compassion for Johorean communities. Held at the Mersing District Office on 7 November 2024, the programme provided assistance to the island communities, whose livelihoods were disrupted by the monsoon season. A comprehensive relief package served as a lifeline for families of fishermen and boat operators, addressing both their immediate and long-term needs. Yayasan JCorp also provided school supplies worth RM17,600 and a KFC meal to children on Johor's islands.

Alongside efforts for monsoon victims, Yayasan JCorp extended support to two fire-affected families in Kampung Wak Salam on 8 November 2024, with cash assistance and essential household items. This support was complemented with housing assistance provided by Yayasan Sultan Ibrahim Johor. His Royal Highness Tunku Mahkota Ismail, the Regent of Johor, personally attended the ceremony and presented the keys to the new homes along with the contributions, offering the affected families hope and a fresh start.

Strong Minds, Strong Bonds: Autism and Mental Health Insights

Yayasan JCorp in collaboration with KPJ Puteri Specialist Hospital and Cerebrum, successfully hosted the “Strong Minds, Strong Bonds” forum on 3 November 2024. The forum featured a distinguished panel of experts, including Catriona Ross, passionate Autism Advocate; Assoc. Prof. Dr. Anne Yee Hway Ann, Consultant Psychiatrist & Addiction Specialist at KPJ Puteri Specialist Hospital; Dr. Wan Mohd Azam Wan Mohd Yunus, Senior Lecturer in Clinical Psychology at UTM and Puan Azzyikin Jazuli, Chairman of Persatuan Kanak-Kanak Autistik Islam Johor Bahru. The experts highlighted the challenges of living with autism, effective mental health strategies and the importance of offering caregivers the same mental health support as those they care for.

In conjunction with the forum, a Coping Strategies Workshop organised by KPJ Puteri Specialist was also held. This workshop was designed to empower participants with practical strategies to confidently manage mental health and autism-related challenges in their daily lives. The topics discussed were:

Mental Health Test



Through assessments and one-on-one feedback, an occupational health doctor enabled participants to gain a clearer understanding of their mental health status, thus setting the foundation for healthier routines.

Sensory Integration



An occupational therapist facilitated sensory integration exercises to help improve attention and calm anxiety, while also educating participants on how to create a sensory-friendly environment at home.

Coordination Exercise



In this session, a physiotherapist engaged the participants in a variety of movement and balance exercises aimed at enhancing motor skills. These practical activities demonstrated how exercises support emotional regulation and overall physical well-being.

Desserts vs Stressed



The “Desserts vs Stressed” concept, introduced by the hospital’s Head of Dietetics, provided an insightful look into food choices that support mental wellness. Participants gained knowledge on how diet affects mood and were given tips on making healthier snack choices to reduce stress.

Happy Meals



Led by two hospital chefs, the hands-on cooking session focused on creating nutritious, family-friendly meals that promote joy and connection, while supplying the participants with new recipe ideas to incorporate into daily life.

9 Yayasan JCorp's concern for the Johor Islands community is reflected in its preparation for the Northeast Monsoon season (November 2024 to March 2025), through the donation of school supplies to 79 students from Pulau Tinggi, Pulau Aur, Pulau Sibul, Pulau Pemanggil, and Pulau Besar on 9 November 2024.

Supported by Sakan Mersing, the programme provided each student a RM200 voucher to buy school necessities such as uniforms, shoes, bags and stationery, with Yayasan JCorp helping facilitate the purchases.
