Johor's Youth Shine in Yayasan JCorp Choral Speaking Challenge 2024

Yayasan JCorp, in collaboration with the Johor State Education Department, successfully hosted the 2024 Johor State-Level Choral Speaking Challenge at KOMTAR JBCC on 6 August 2024. Themed "Youth Empowerment for Sustainable Development," this event showcased the speaking and performance skills of 4,780 students from 239 schools across 11 districts in Johor. The competition aimed to promote sustainable development goals (SDGs) by engaging youth in addressing environmental, social and economic challenges. Through intonation, articulation and vocal expression, students demonstrated their proficiency in the English language while raising awareness of pressing global issues.

Empowered Education: STEM Workshop and Sustainable Farming

From 15 to 18 July 2024, 40 enthusiastic teachers gathered at the National Institute of Education (NIE) in Singapore for a STEM Workshop (Part 1) aimed at advancing STEM education in Johor. Organised by Yayasan JCorp in collaboration with Temasek Foundation and several partners, the workshop focused on integrating sustainable farming into school curriculums.

Teachers were introduced to modern techniques and IoT systems, equipping them with the skills needed to teach urban agriculture in their schools.

Five schools—SMK Bandar Baru Uda, SMK Telok Kerang, SMK Bandar Penawar, SMK Buluh Kasap and SMK Seri Medan—were selected for this initiative. The project involved the construction of smart greenhouses, which will play a key role in educating students about modern farming techniques and sustainability.

One Million Roots for the Future: Mangrove Planting Initiative

On 7 August 2024, Yayasan JCorp, in collaboration with Johor Plantations Group (JPG) and Pertubuhan Sahabat Hutan Bakau Pulau Tanjung Surat (PSHBTS), led a significant mangrove planting initiative at Pulau Tanjung Surat, Kota Tinggi. This event was part of JPG's long-term environmental campaign, **One Million Roots for the Future**, which aims to plant one million mangrove trees by 2033. During the event, 55 volunteers helped plant 1,000 mangrove trees, contributing to the preservation and restoration of the coastal ecosystem.

The initiative also included a RM3,000 donation from Yayasan JCorp to SK Tanjung Surat's Parent-Teacher Association (PIBG), supporting students and helping to improve educational resources.

On 21 September 2024, Yayasan JCorp, in collaboration with UTM Campus Sustainability (UTMCS), participated in the World Rivers Day 2024 celebration at Sungai Tebrau. As part of this event, the Kutip Sampah Sambil Riadah (KUDAH) programme was conducted, involving 300 volunteers who worked together to collect 857.1 kg of waste along the riverbanks. In conjunction with World Rivers Day, Yayasan JCorp and UTMCS hosted Train of Trainers (TOT) programme on 25 September 2024 at Tunku Mahkota Ismail Youth Centre (TMIYC). The programme empowered 120 students from six schools with advanced river conservation techniques and sustainable practices, leveraging cutting-edge digital tools like the iNaturalist app to drive environmental stewardship and foster a new generation of eco-leaders.

3 International Conference on Future and Sustainable Education (ICFSE 2024)

4 Smart Greenhouse Launch at SMK Taman Universiti 2, Johor Bahru

Aimed at 120 students from six schools, the programme provided hands-on training in river conservation techniques, including water quality assessment, sustainable planting and the use of digital tools like the iNaturalist app for biodiversity monitoring. This initiative was designed to equip young participants with the knowledge and skills to lead future environmental conservation efforts in their communities.



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
